Did you know?

In Portugal Hans Detusch, an Austrian artist met the Reverend Charles Joy, executive director of the newly developed Unitarian Service Committee (USC). The USC was founded in Boston to assist Eastern Europeans among them, Unitarians as well as Jews, who needed to escape Nazi persecution. From his Lisbon headquarters, Joy oversaw a secret network of couriers and agents. Deutsch had his own escape, having drawn cartoons critical of Adolf Hitler. In 1941, he made a pen and ink drawing combining the flame and chalice. This became the Unitarian Symbol and logo for papers, badges, and for the service workers. Deutsch was most impressed with the way the USC served, soon working for and with the workers. When this artist designed the flaming chalice, "he had never seen a Unitarian or Universalist church or heard a sermon. What he had seen was faith in action—people who were willing to risk all for others in a time of urgent need."
