May 7th, 10 am, "Who Are We?"

The statement of Principles & Purposes is the foundation of Unitarian Universalism. It is the covenant to which congregations pledge themselves as members of the UUA. A Study Commission was charged with reviewing Article II (i.e., Principles & Purposes) and propose revisions enabling UUism, "to be a relevant and powerful force for spiritual and moral growth, healing, and justice." The changes were to be consistent with core UU theological values, and the UUA Board advocated love as the central value.

This Sunday, Catie Ballard and Jeff Lockwood will lead a discussion of the proposed wording of Article II to help our religious community understand the changes and provide feedback to UUFL delegates who will vote on the new version at the UUA General Assembly in June. May 14th, 10 am, "Our Universalist Roots and Branches" led by Rev. Kalen Fristad

Rev. Kalen Fristad focuses on roots and branches of universalism, including John Murray and how he came to believe in universalism in England, the early history of universalism in the American Colonies, Thomas Potter and his chapel in New Jersey, and the subsequent spread of universalism up until the present time. Rev. Fristad has been a United Methodist minister for more than 40 years, and is a member of the Unitarian Universalist Christian Fellowship. He retired from the parish ministry in 2013, but continues to travel the country speaking on universalism. Over the years he has spoken at more than 240 UU churches.

Rev. Leslie Kee—Thoughts for May

Along with the usual stirrings of spring, it feels like the eternal motion of change is pushing us to pay a bit closer attention these days. As participants in this wonderful open-minded spiritual tradition called Unitarian Universalism, our principles and purposes call us to pay attention to those human behaviors that inform, construct, and guide the norms which structure how we co-exist in a civic community. In particular, today's headlines are recording democracy's response to the un-healthy forces of autocracy, antisemitism, racism, misogyny, and anti-intellectualism fueled by pure power-mongering and greed. But the slow and steady push-back from those of us who understand what is going on and who know the high stakes is very reassuring!

From the institutions within the judicial branch of government to the power of grassroots activism, the imperative to contribute to the health of our democracy is a defining feature of this moment in history – and Wyoming is not exempt from this imperative to pay attention and find ways to act. The threat of elected representatives pushing an extremist agenda in order to privilege their narrow religious beliefs over our entire state is unacceptable, and the eyes of the nation are watching.
